Nótaí Foghlama- Learning Notes

<u>Gaeilge</u>: We would really hope children can maintain contact with Gaeilge while learning from home. They were reaching a fantastic stage of fluency ar scoil and this was achieved with your support! Below are some more game-based resources the children will enjoy. Encourage the children to create sentences when listening to the words from the games.

Sound of the week (Ww and Xx) -Discuss the sound. Think of words with this sound. -Practise writing the letter in the sky, on the table, on your hand, back, tummy using your finger.

Leabhar Beag Buí: I have scanned in the pages from their very first reader. This reader is based on the words that the children have been learning over the past few weeks.

Scríbhneoireacht: The children will be familiar with the concept of leaving a "finger space" between letters or words when writing. Use the sentences from the Leabhar Beag Buí to write and I have also included some examples in the timetable.

<u>Mata</u>: This week we are continuing to work on number 5. Write out the story of 5, write it out, manipulate concrete materials to make 5 e.g. 2 oranges and 3 oranges make 5 oranges etc. Continue to write 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 also. I have scanned in the pages from their Maths book this week.

<u>Aistear</u>: I have given some suggestions for the Garden Centre/ Flower Shop in the suggested timetable and with the pictures below to get creative juices flowing. I have attached some vocabulary also. The children can make posters for their Flower Shop/ Garden Centre. Posters with prices, flowers, pots, seeds, opening and closing times these will help greatly with learning time and money. Ensure that the prices are all 'doable' for your child, so less than 10c is a good idea but again depending on 'your' own child's abilities. You can help them identify coins with this little sheet <u>https://www.twinkl.ie/resource/roi-n-5581-senior-infants-euro-amo unts-peg-cards</u> but better still let them manipulate money (coins) regularly with you.

They can sell pots, seeds, rakes, spades, buckets and bags of soil in their shop. Children are always welcome to make their own variation of ice cream parlour out of Lego or any similar construction activity.)

OSIE: I have included two pages from their own book. One is based on Spring and the other on what a flower needs to survive. If you have seeds at home why not plant one in a yogurt pot!
